



## **VENICE ARTS FILMMAKING & ANIMATION EDUCATION INTERNSHIP**

Venice Arts' mission is to ignite youths' imagination, mentor their creativity, and expand their sense of possibility through high quality, accessible media-based arts education programs; and to serve as a catalyst for people of all ages, living in low-income or underrepresented communities, to create and share personal and community stories through photography, film, and multi-media.

### **Internship Description**

Venice Arts' College Internship Program offers a range of internships that train college students interested in working in the arts, both during the academic year and in the summer months. The Filmmaking & Animation Education Intern will develop their skills and knowledge in arts education by assisting in Venice Arts' filmmaking and animation programs for low-income youth. Interns will receive training in assisting in the programs; maintaining the digital labs; maintaining film equipment, preparing content to post online; DVD creation, archiving of student work, assisting with organization of film screenings, and potentially mentoring youth in our filmmaking and animation programs.

This is generally an unpaid, part-time internship (8–16 hours per week based on availability), training directly with the Lead Filmmaker. Academic credit and a financial stipend may be available depending on your university.

### **Qualifications**

The ideal intern is a filmmaking or animation student with experience working digitally. She or he is well-organized, motivated, and comfortable working in a community-based setting. Proficiency on Macintosh computers required. General experience with Final Cut Pro and file management preferred.
